

Ken Raymer serves on the Post Executive Committee. As the Judge Advocate, Ken was instrumental in the drafting and implementation of updated post bylaws and constitution. He has also spearheaded, as Entertainment Committee chair, social events such as post installation, Christmas Party, Birthday Dinner, and Post Picnic. Of particular note is his capable handling of a major post Feather Party fundraising event. Thanks, Ken.

Mike Stojak serves on the Post Executive Committee. His primary role has been as House Manager. Mike has re-defined the position by establishing employee job descriptions and evaluations. He has spearheaded the implementation of a modern bar point-of-sale system and budget for the house operation. Under the direction of the House Committee, Mike has worked diligently to update and modernize our facilities to include the Honor Garden, remodeled rest rooms, a new beer cooler, and others. Under his management, the bar operations has grown from \$532,000 in revenue in 2020 to an estimated \$900,000 this year. Mike has chaired the VetFest committee for seven year with profits growing each year. Thanks, Mike.

Tim Nash has served on the Post Executive Committee. He has taken on responsibility for many post projects, such as Wreaths Across America, Legion School Awards, and Student and Descendant scholarships. Tim has also spearheaded many of our community service donations such as Senior Care Volunteer Network and the Huntley Chamber of Commerce. Donations to these causes exceed \$37,000. Thanks, Tim.

I want to thank our employees, full-time and part-time. Your dedication to quality customer service and veterans' services make our post one of the top social destinations in Huntley. Thank you all.

Finally, I want to thank Suzan Hoehn of the Auxiliary and Mike Thackwray of the Sons for their support and cooperation to the Legion Family. We could not be who we are without you.



Speaker May Meeting - Patrick Kenneally


The McHenry County States Attorney, Patrick Kenneally, spoke at our May Legion Meeting about identity theft and crime prevention.

- Freeze your credit by contacting the 3 credit bureaus:
 - Equifax
 - Experian
 - Trans Union
- If you have been a victim of ID Theft, you can contact the Illinois Attorney General Identity Theft Division
